WHY THEY LOVE LEAD4WARD

Susan Nall, Principal at Snow Heights Elementary, explained that the work they've done and plan to continue has changed the instructional culture on their campus. Leaders, teachers, and students show increased enthusiasm for learning and have richer conversations about growth.



THE CHALLENGE

Post-COVID, Principal Nall noticed a drastic difference in the level of classroom engagement. With the transition from online learning back to in-person learning, she recognized that instructional strategies for student engagement were not being integrated into classroom instruction. While the district gave campuses a data book and goals for their campuses, there wasn't a clear path for how to accomplish the goals.

THE SOLUTION

After attending a lead4ward session at a TEPISA conference, Principal Nall was intrigued by the connection between growth and engaging learners. She invited lead4ward to provide on-campus professional learning for teachers that focused on learning lead4ward resources, using the lead4ward app in the classroom, and understanding the importance of engaging learners during instruction.

THE RESULT

The results are visible campus-wide. Teachers and students are excited, and the strategies helped create a common vision and language around learning. Snow Heights Elementary went from a C campus to a B campus (just 3 points shy of being an A campus) in just one year.
